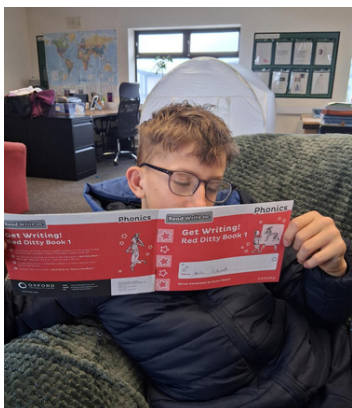
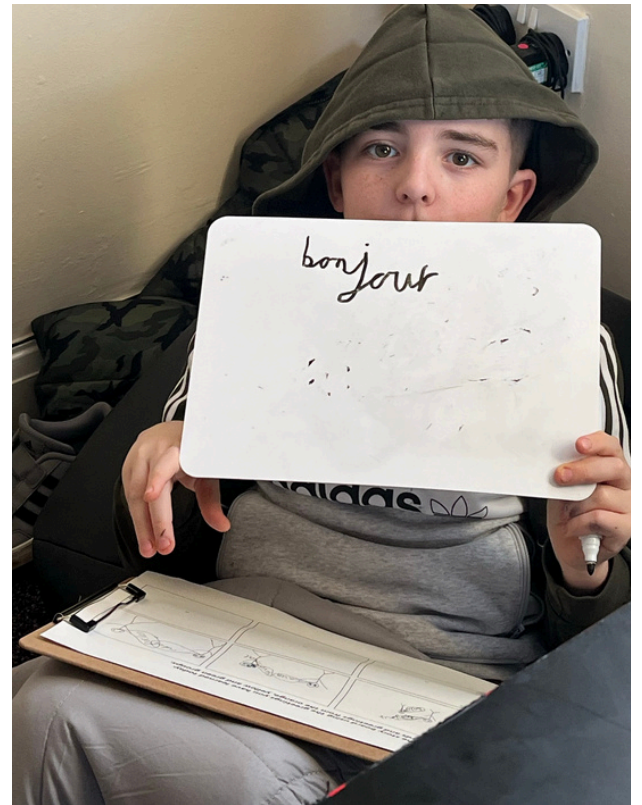


This term, a student in each class has been voted to be a member of our Student Council and our first meeting has taken place. We look forward to this progressing and getting more feedback from our students

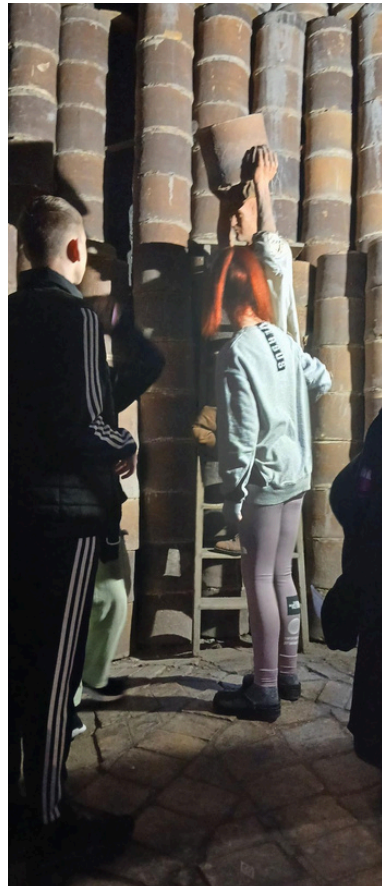
The year 7's have had lots of opportunities to learn in the community, including visiting a Gurdwara and going into the local market to taste lots of different fruit

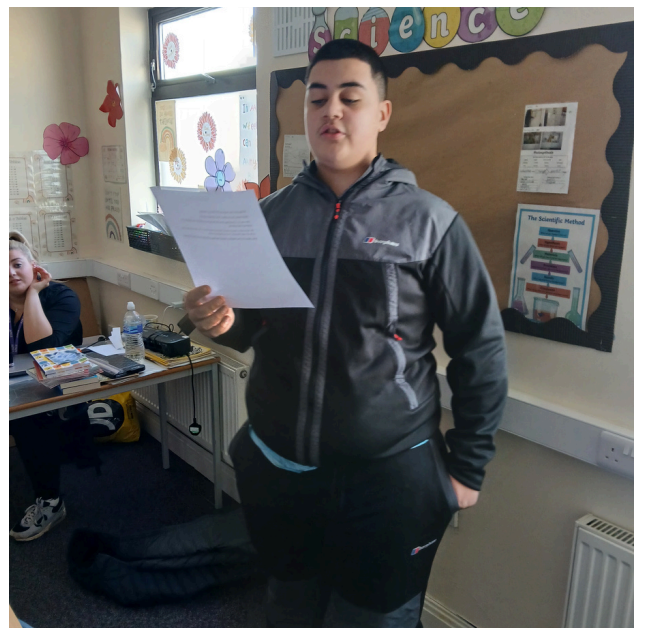

I felt good at the top, I was so proud I rang my mum to show her - CWM

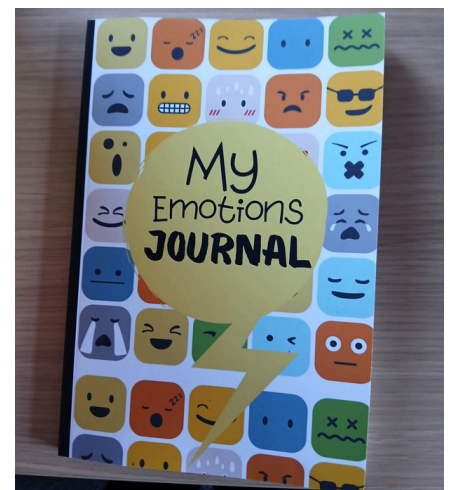
I enjoyed the drive there, it literally looked like I was in a different country and then the views at the top were 10/10 - CO
